





ROSE HILL COPPER RIDGE

CADDY BOOK



- **Players MUST CHECK-IN** at the Starter Tent at their assigned course 10 minutes prior to their tee time.
- **DO NOT go to Tee Pad #1** Groups will be sent to the tee from the starters tent
- Electronic scoring is the primary method being used:
 - pdga.com/score
 - TCO23 is the code
 - o confirm and submit your score within 30 minutes of finishing your round
 - paper scorecard are for BACK UP ONLY!
 - o at least 2 players must keep digital score

TEE ASSIGNMENTS

- Players are responsible to know their tee times. https://www.pdga.com/tour/event/64426
- Arrive well ahead of time to ensure parking
- DO NOT go to tee pad #1
- Check -in with the Course Director at the Starter Area
- All groups will have a quick Q & A with the Course Director at the Starter Tent.
- Any course information outside of the Caddy Book, will be relayed to the players at this time.
- If a player is not present at the tee pad at the start of the round with their assigned group, the player is considered absent and does not play the hole.
- The absent player receives a score of par + 4 for each hole not played.

HAZARDS & OUT of BOUNDS

There are stakes lining fairways at both courses. The front of the stake, facing into the fairway, is the OB line.

Pay attention to the colour of the *tops* of the stakes

YELLOW = HAZARD play it as it lies with a stroke penalty

RED = **OUT OF BOUNDS** standard OB rules apply

SAND TRAPS at Mac Island play as **HAZARD**

FENCE LINES - the front of the post, facing the fairway is the OB line

PAINTED WHITE LINES - play as out of bounds - the line itself is OB

MANDOS/MANDATORIES

Both course have Mandos & Restricted Areas. Please know the rules of play for both.

https://www.pdga.com/news/pdga-official-rules-disc-golf-competition-manual-updated-2022 All of the Mandos have a drop zone.

NEVER unwind from a Mando! This is not allowed!

BARBED WIRE

2 meters relief is given from all barbed wire.

There is a barbed wire fence that surrounds the Rose Hill & Copper Ridge property and it plays as OUT OF BOUNDS.

MCARTHUR ISLAND


Welcome to the McArthur Island Disc Golf Course. Don't let the size of this course fool you! There is all kinds of opportunity to give strokes to your card! Out of Bounds is in play on all 18 holes, so keeping it in the fairway is the safe play! This Eric McCabe design will keep you coming back, wanting to bring that score down even lower! The towering willows will rob you and the swirling afternoon wind will confuse you! Play smart and you'll be in good shape!

We ask that you give consideration to the natural/wild piece of the course and stay out of the fenced pond areas. There are not only ducks in there with nests, but also turtles nested in the silty banks. If your disc goes in the water, please use a retriever from the fence line or consider it lost until the TCO volunteers are able to safely go in and retrieve discs.

All Divisions Play the Temp back pad
Welcome to the Tournament Capital Open!
Kick things off with an elevated basket, ob,
mando and a nasty willow.

Good luck out there! Presenting Sponsor:





An OB that sneaks up really quick on a fast green. Pick your pace correctly and get that birdie. Bring your putting game for the rest of the round and score low!



Tight finish on this one... but not so tight where an eagle could still fly... hmm. Lookout for lots of ob along this fairway.



Yeah its an island hole...

Make the island and you've got yourself an interesting putt.

Don't make the island and proceed to the dropzone. From there the choice is yours.

Run it to save the par or lay up and take your medicine. Standard OB Rules in play after playing from the drop zone.



One of the toughest holes on the course.

A long straight tunnel with a left finish at the end. OB on your left that can come into play as well. Miss the Mando and its a difficult bogey save from there. If you miss the Mandatory's advance to the drop zone.

Good luck on this one!

Mandatory restricted zone is continued directly.

Mandatory restricted zone is continued directly to the left or right of the trees.



Lefties and forehand players rejoice. This one's for you. OB on the left hand side and some foliage that will knock down most inside routes. There is OB on the right if you take a very inside line.

Plan your angles accordingly here!



To swim or not to swim. This might be a short hole but placement is key here. The green is fast and unforgiving with OB on each side. The OB is defined by the fence line.



Nestled on the hillside in the trees is a birdie waiting for you. OB path on the right and directly behind the basket makes distance control your biggest ally here. Leave yourself short and you'll have an interesting uphill putt. OB early defined by fencing as well.





Distance and OB. A match made for bogeys.

OB fence with water on your left and and OB path on the right. Both can quickly come into play. A guardian tree on the hill at the end that is protecting those birdies. Beat them all and prove me wrong!



One for the Pros and not so pro. This hole can be a doozy. A slight left to right hole with lots of trees on either side and a few branches across the middle that make this a definite control shot.

OB left on the path and right... in the river (water OB).



If a course has a must get... this is it! A short right to left shot protected by a cement column. OB on this one is the river on the right, path on the back side and on top of the cement column. Show me some birdies!



Avoid the hazards and OB. A tucked away basket that misses playing in the sand.



Some courses just have mean baskets... and this is one of them. Rollaways are frequent and getting caught up early makes your look at a birdie difficult.

Hazard early and OB on the left hand side.



Elevation, ah my old friend.
Wind reads and a proper choice of disc are imperative here for success.
OB on your left hand side.



Lets test your knowledge of playing disc golf with willows. (Hint willows usually win)

A nice left to right hole with OB down the entire left hand side. Miss the Mando and you are advancing to a dropzone.

(will be marked)



A gentle touch here... and I mean gentle. This downhill shot can get away from you quickly.

OB near the basket makes this short one interesting!




Tight fairway, OB left and right.

OB cart path on the right.

Did I mention there's a river on the right as well, yeah please avoid that one for the sake of your disc.

Go for big distance and have a short approach? It's dealers choice here!



Hey you've made it
Welcome to hole 18 at McArthur Island!
OB left & right.
Right side OB carries all the way past the basket.
Lines will vary based on pad.

ROSE HILL


Welcome to the Rose Hill Disc Golf Course. Once one of Canada's longest and most challenging courses, this OG would have some great stories to share if trees could talk! Having hosted the likes of Paige Pierce, Eric McCabe, Avery Jenkins and so many more, this course has not only tested the pros but made it through a pine beetle infestation and continues to be morphed into a challenging, scenic, track. Perched on a plateau that once was the bottom of Kamloops Lake, the course plays host to the infamous afternoon desert wind. This one element alone has chased away a lot of dreams of Personal Best rounds. Now with added OB and strategically placed baskets, happy par becomes a welcome score!

Keeping it in the fairway will be the advantage to those with even a big arm! Get off the fairway and scrambling through sagebrush, pine trees and cactus becomes mandatory!

Be sure to steal a moment, when you can, to take in the views offered throughout the course! It really is a special place tucked up in the hills above the sprawling valley bottom. A very different experience than that of Mac Island!







Welcome to the Tournament Capital Open!

Hop onto the runway at hole 1 and proceed to takeoff.

Hazard on the left and OB right.

Right side extends all the way around #2.

Fast green and a drop off behind the pin,
hopefully you're warmed up to score early!



Things are better when shared right?


Hole 2 is the same pad for all divisions with OB long behind the basket.... and trust me you'll thank us for letting you come back up the cliff that's behind it if you go long.

This hole has an elevated structure that even on calm days will test your putting skills!



You might get a sense that Rose Hill... has some punishing hills.

Clear the small ravine and find yourself in a position to go for it, with caution. Steep gulley behind the basket that can warm those legs up early.



All Divisions play the Blue Pad

Don't get caught staring at the views for too long here.

Get a picture of your birdie and get out!

A unforgiving slope is behind the basket on this one, plan accordingly!



All Divisions play the Blue Pad

I hope for your sake you don't end up on the OB road down to the left... but I've been there and I feel for you if that happens.


Left side of the fairway is a long a large hill that will show you how well a disc can roll.

Shorter hole but anything can happen at Rose Hill.



A nice dog leg Par 4.

A solid drive will setup a touch approach for a birdie. Big arms might even have a eagle look. Find yourself off the green and you'll be testing a bit of your scramble with trees surrounding the basket.



All Divsions play the Blue Pad
A personal favourite!
OB road long (it's really long)
Gaps to hit, or fly right above it all.
A gentle slope downhill that starts around halfway to the basket,
elevated basket and an interesting green.
Hit your line and get rewarded!



A dealers choice, one pad wonder of a hole.

OB long and OB if you land in the tennis court.

Trees left of the basket and long.

Shot is a slight left to right.

Show your disc knowledge off and make it look easy.

Shared Pad for all divisions.



All Divisions play the Red Pad
Hazard, hazard everywhere.

OB tennis court, which will proceed you to a dropzone off of the tee. Afterwards it is standard OB rules. Hazard after the path surrounding the basket.

Good news... C1 is safe, just have to get there!

Par 3 for Blue Layout
Par 4 for Reds



All Divisions Play the Blue Pad

Welcome to the back 9 at Rose, some wooded holes and big shots ahead.
#10, OB road on the left, Triple Mando with the standard red pad as the drop zone if its missed.
The Gates of Rosehalla, dine on a birdie here!



Well, hope you caught your breath from the little hike because you're going uphill even more.

OB left on the road and OB barbwire fence long.
A few different ways to attack this one!



Sound the alarm (bamboo wrapped trees)!
Triple Mando with the drop zone being the am pad. Downhill shot with a few trees to beat.

Your initial release better be good otherwise its going to be a tough par save, trust me when I say that.



OB barbed wire fence long on this one.
Slight elevation gain and a choose your adventure shot. Choose the low gap or attack the sky.



Word of advice, speed control... guess that words of advice but you get it.

Downhill shot, how your disc's flight finished will determine your putt.

Mine prefer to be under nearby trees.



A few routes to take never hurt anyone. From big hyzers, hyzer flips and the odd flex forehand. Avoid the trees and shrubs!

OB fence long of the basket.



For those about to crush, we salute you. For those playing it safe. Well played.

OB left hand side near the edge for the ravine,

OB behind the basket and OB on the right. Fast green. Place your shots accordingly!



If there was an opening for a big shot, this is it!

There's a big tree in the middle,
pick your route.

Protected green with a nice pocket opening to
access it with your approach shot.

OB on the right hand side.



All Divisons Play the Alt Pad

Congratulations on making it through Rose Hill.

Hope plenty of birdies came your way.

Finishing on the alt pad is a 301ft downhill left to right hole. OB is around the basket and continues up the path.

Couple routes to take. End it with a birdie!

COPPER RIDGE

Copper Ridge Disc Golf Course is a picturesque 18-hole course located in the heart of Logan Lake, British Columbia. The course is set in a beautiful park with plenty of trees, offering a unique and enjoyable disc golf experience for players of all skill levels. This course has been in the ground and been the host of BC Provincials and Canadians! Pay attention to those teesigns!







Welcome to Copper Ridge hole #1. This one gets you used to this course's theme pretty quick.
Woods, elevation and an sloped green.
Pick your line and fire away.
Good luck on the round ahead.
Uphill shot to get things started.



If you can't see the basket on this one... you're in good company. There's a small gap in the tree line below and it's about 40ft past the opening. A birdie here is a reward of a well placed shot.



Finally.. a basket you can see of the teepad.

A few guardian trees to content with but nothing you can't handle.






One of the shortest holes you'll find out here.

Green has been a little fast in years past.

Time to pull that ace out of your sleeve!




Take a moment to appreciate the view when at the basket! There is a pretty good slope on the left hand side if you get caught leaking out that way. Shot play uphill a fair amount. Try to stay up top.. if you can.



Pick your line on this one! Get caught up early and you'll be in trouble here. Basket is downhill and to the left of the pad.





Where to roll the dice on this? Take the big outside line or take the inside gap. A bit of a downhill shot. Go long and end up in the base of a tree. A fair green that often rewards your drives with birdies.




I'm tempted to take a jump or two (bike park to the right) A bunch of trees guarding the straight line to the basket on this uphill shot.


Use nature to your advantage here on this uphill shot.




She may be short story but an elegant one. A personal favourite. A slight left to right shot with a significant slope around circles edge on the right hand side. An uphill shot in a somewhat tight fairway.



Welcome to the back nine. This uphill, downhill trend continues on with this one. A downhill touch shot with trees on either side of the fairway along with a big guardian tree in the circle.



The basket may be out of view... but its up there I promise. A nice left to right fairway and a uphill shot here. Trend... continues. Behind the basket is some barbwire I'd advise to stay away from but play your game.



Hole 12... ah many thoughts are had here. Lots of OB; barbwire fence and pond. The pond OB will be marked by red plastic stakes.

This is a well protected green that could definitely add some unwanted strokes to your scorecard, maybe its just me... Good luck on this one!



Take a breather before proceeding to throw.

Really. A good climb leads to a good throw. A

fun green and a good line to hit.



Well you've made it to the top.. mostly. OB barbwire fence on the left hand side.

Significant downhill slope on the backside of the basket along with the right hand side.

Plenty of foliage to mess up your shot, but my goodness getting there feels good.



15, Lets start off with a bunch of barbed wire on the left and deep of the pin. You'll be safe in the circle. Please a reminder, there is no good entry in the barbed wire zone on this hole. Please inform the TD of any lost discs and we will try to get them back to you.

Straight shot to the pin... simple, right?



Hey a par 4, wondering where this was hiding.

The shot is uphill with a well.. well its an interesting green. Perched on a hill with trees surrounding the pin and a marsh on the long end of things.



Back to back another par 4 here. Play with the view and attack the ridge!

OB is long of the pin and mostly along the ridge marked by red plastic stakes.

Definitely a hole where wind can come into play.



This ends in Copper Ridge style.

If you were a Venetian seamstress in a past life then this one's for you. Weave that line and get rewarded on this massively downhill shot. Easy to get caught up early or pure the gap and carry 100ft long. Hope you enjoyed your round at Copper Ridge!
